





Register / Login (cont'd)

- Creation of User Names
 - Generated from names entered in the First Name and Family Name boxes
 - All characters will be in lower case
 - No spaces in the user name
- Recognises ScienceDirect user name / password
- If a user attempts to register with an email address already known to Scopus
 - Elect to be emailed a User Name or Password reminder
 - Edit the registration using another email address
 - Register another user name on the duplicated email account

Types of Search

- Known Item Search searcher knows item is available; uses known info to retrieve it (e.g. author/title etc.).
- Unknown Item Search searcher is unaware/not looking for specific item; uses various terms & synonyms according to his/her info needs (e.g. subject search)
- Free-text Search a.k.a. 'Basic Search'; usually several fields searched concurrently (e.g. title, author, subject, keywords, etc.). Simple BUT tends to retrieve many irrelevant items
- **Field-specific Search** a.k.a. 'Advanced Search'; search usually limited to one or more specific fields. Retrieves more relevant items BUT some expertise required



Search Syntax (1)

Phrase Searching:

- "tourism industry" = exact phrase
- tourism industry = tourism AND industry

Proximity Searching:

- word order *not* specified W/nn
 - pain W/5 morphine
- word order specified

neonatal PRE/3 screening

PRE/nn



Search Syntax (2)

Wildcards (truncation):


- variable number of characters *
 - colo*r = color, colour
 - cat* = cat, cats, catatonic, catastrophe, etc.
- fixed number of characters ?
 - wom?n = woman, women
 - catheter? = catheter, catheters(but not catheterization)






AND • OR • AND NOT










Search Syntax (3)

Search Field Qualification:

- FieldName (SearchTerm)
 - title ("prion disease")= single field search
 - title-abs-key (koala) = compound field search
 - When no field name is specified, all searchable fields are assumed


Search Within Results



- Use query box at bottom of results page
 - Condensed version of advanced search query
- Enter terms to refine original search query
- Searches all fields of the database
- Use command search syntax to specify search fields
 - FieldName (SearchTerm)
- Perform an unlimited number of search refinements
- All refinements performed appear in Search History



 - Session-based temporary list unless saved
- Clicking My List button displays temporary list





- Appears on every page except home page
- Fixed field search
 - titles, abstracts, author keywords, index keywords, authors
- Search terms are ANDed
 - Use quotation marks to search a phrase
- All searches performed appear in Search History


