

From this screen user can ① search The Chronicle, ② view and/or read news, articles, features, special reports, opinions and ideas, facts and figures, advice, and events, ③ find and submit jobs, ④ view and/or share blogs, and ⑤ search jobs.

Search The Chronicle

Enter "chinese student" into the search box and click "Search." The results are displayed as figure below.



This search box is available on any Topic /section page for user to conveniently search whenever needed.

From the search results screen, user can **①** refine results by using search filters provided, namely publication date within, content type, and topic, and **②** sort by relevance, date and more. The figure below shows results *refined by date published within* (less than 1 year), *content type* (article), and *topic* (global).



View The Chronicle


The Chronicle enables user to view all pages of those published online in the same manner as reading the printed issue. The Menu bar on Home page provides sections to view more in details: news, opinion & ideas, fact & figures, advice, and events, see figure below.



On Home screen, the Chronicle provides the frontpage liked of the printed issue, with all premium contents of the day / week, in the U.S. and in the world, selected from different sections available. Columns like "Most Popular", "Academic Culture", and "The Chronicle Review" are always on Home page. See figure above. Try more from the menu bar, click "News", "Opinion & Ideas", or "Facts & Figures", or "Advice". Sample figures are as below.



From all of those above sections on menu bar, when selecting any item within, user can view full text, as well as *e-Mail*, *print*, *comment*, and *share*. For example, click on item "*Graduate School Is Art School*" from "**Advice**" section, full detailed article is displayed with further use options for the user. See figure below.



Chronicle Blogs


What provided more online than on the printed issue is that user can view and/or post blogs and add a comment, see menu bar on Home page below.
